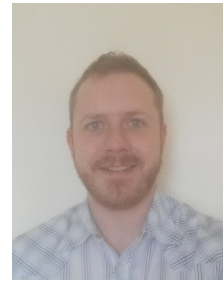


- 2011: I was Chorus Master for the MIDAS Musical ‘The Wedding Singer’
